Since leaving U.S. Customs after a successful career, Walter has supported several USAID, World Bank, Asian Development Bank and private sector projects, including field work as a portfolio, programme, or project manager.

He has also built successful public integrity (anti-corruption) programmes. He has extensive project management experience and is a certified as a Project Manager (PMP) by the Project Management Institute and Quality Auditor (CQA) by the

American Society for Quality.

Walter has served as a volunteer in PMI including work as a technical reviewer of the Standard for Project Risk Management and in the International Development Community of Practice.

His border management innovations include developing the first Comprehensive Integrated Tariff System (CITS), holistic border management reforms through a multi-agency Border Management Task Force (BMTF), and regulatory risk management based on measured/managed private sector self-regulation (Full Circle Due Diligence© and Four Aspects of Risk©).

Both from within the U.S. Customs and as a consultant he has supported the development and functioning of free zones including - feasibility studies for the creation of new free zones - the drafting of enabling laws and regulations - practical application of best business practice.

Walter's free zone experience includes work in the United States, multiple countries including the Balkans, Eastern Europe, Central Asia and the Middle East and Africa. His approach to free zone management is to demystify and simplify the free zone regime so that both business and customs work in partnership.
