

INTRODUCTION

This Seminar has been brought up to date since the last Edition in 2019. Speakers will review and discuss many of the current issues which affect the design, implementation, operation and marketing of Zones throughout the world.

The challenges are even greater in all world economies but Zones are continuing to impress with their growth. Nevertheless even countries and regions which have created successful programmes need to constantly assess their development and to make changes now, rather than later.

Despite the great variety in Zones, as well as their position and profile in the investment climate of a particular geographic entity there are some unifying factors which influence success. The current trade climate is not helping global economies as corporates struggle to find a way to continue development with less risk. Strategy and capability go hand in hand and this seminar will offer participants the opportunity to cut to the heart of the decision-making processes which will eventually impact them and what they have to offer.

Throughout the two days reference will be made to technology advances including Industry 4.0: Robotics and AI, Data centres, using technology for Target Sector Identification of prospects, Supply Chain/Blockchain and also Fintech opportunities.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The Seminar will be of value to national officials dealing with policy matters which relate to investments and special economic zones policies. They are also important for Zone Authorities, Investment Promotion Agencies, specialist and professional advisers and others working in the field of Foreign Direct Investment. Multi and trans-national corporations and investors are concerned with trade issues, risk assessment, practical customs and other commercial considerations. Zone operators, customs authorities and other specialists - including legal, tax and trade advisers - will need to understand the practical effects on Zone management of incentives. They will all need to review the increased use of international internet related systems.

SPEAKERS

The Seminar will be introduced by **Graham Mather C.B.E.**, Chairman of World Free Zone Convention. Graham is a lawyer by training who sits on two major UK Regulatory Boards as well as being President of the European Policy Forum.

Paola Suarez Buhrmann

Paola started her professional career in 2010 at ProBarranquilla, a regional investment promotion agency in Colombia, where she worked for over three years in the area of investment promotion. During her time at this agency, she organized and participated in national and international missions to actively promote the Atlantico region as a location for companies seeking new locations. As a result, Paola was able to support around 200 Colombian and foreign companies considering establishment or expansion projects and supported the attraction of more than 20 investment projects that invested about US\$200 million and created over 2,000 new jobs in the Atlantico region.

Before joining FDI Center on March 2018, Paola worked at Invest in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, a regional investment promotion agency in Germany, where she was responsible for investment attraction across multiple industries, including automotive and renewable energies. She represented the state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern in different events across Europe and China and worked closely with public authorities and associations at the local and regional level to attract investment to the region. Her previous experience also includes working at the European headquarters of Kia Motors in Frankfurt, South Korea's second-largest automobile manufacturer, where she conducted analyses of customer satisfaction and assisted in the planning and implementation of national and European trainings and workshops.

At FDI Center, Paola has been working on various projects related to FDI attraction strategy and the operations of investment promotion agencies, including the analysis of German foreign direct investment to China over the last years, the evaluation of Business Finland's role in attracting high value investment to the country, and the elaboration of an international target market analysis for a city in North America. Currently, some of the projects where Paola is involved include the development of a comprehensive and practical strategy for attracting investment for a new investment promotion agency in Australia and the identification of companies in the cardiovascular industry that have potential for establishing operations in Asia-Pacific. Besides, Paola participates as speaker at events focused on foreign direct investment and is also involved in the delivery of training courses focused on investment attraction, creation of value proposition, special economic zones, investor targeting, and lead generation.

Paola holds a Master of Science in International Economics and Public Policy from the Johannes-Gutenberg University in Germany and a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations from the Universidad del Norte in Colombia. She speaks English, German, and Spanish.

Sebastian Reil

Before joining FDI Center, Sebastian was a consultant with Kearney. His work involved developing business strategies as well as operational improvements for companies in the transportation and infrastructure industry across Europe and the Middle East. For example, he developed a business strategy for a new railway company in the Middle East and helped a leading European airline to improve its punctuality performance. His previous experience further includes business model development at Siemens Novel Business (now next47) with a focus on industrial blockchain applications and supporting the startup ecosystem at the Chamber of Industry and Commerce in Munich.

Sebastian started his professional career in investment attraction at a specialized consulting firm in the Netherlands, where he helped investment promotion agencies in emerging markets to develop their sector targeting and improve their marketing efforts as well as helped companies in finding new locations.

Sebastian was a Yenching Scholar at Peking University in China, where he was part of the team of former World Bank chief economist Justin Lin Yifu on developing special economic zone strategies and monitoring and evaluation tools for governments in Africa and South Asia. During this time, he also wrote a report on institutions and organizations facilitating FDI from SMEs into the greater Shanghai area as well as several academic papers on free zones and FDI.

At FDI Center, Sebastian has been working on various projects related to FDI attraction strategy. Some of the projects in which Sebastian has been involved include the site analysis and development of promotional material for a municipality in Scandinavia that aims to attract data centers and the sector and analysis of target groups for the Parkes Special Activation Precinct in NSW, Australia. Sebastian is also involved in the development and delivery of training courses related to foreign direct investment and recently delivered a series of training modules for a new industrial city in Saudi Arabia.

Sebastian holds a Master of Arts in China Studies from Peking University in China, a Master of Science in International Economics and Business from the University of Groningen in the Netherlands and a Bachelor of Science in Economics from the University of Heidelberg in Germany. He speaks English, German, and Chinese.
